3. Innovation Workshop Series (Tomorrow, June 11th)

Are you interested in learning how to translate basic research discoveries into practical applications? On Thursday, June 11th, the Innovation Workshop Series will feature speakers Rifat Pamukcu , M.D., president and CEO of Midway Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and John Alverdy, M.D., Vice Chairman, Department of Surgery, at the University of Chicago.

Midway Pharmaceuticals was founded in 2005 with the support of UChicagoTech. The company develops nonantibiotic therapies for hospital-acquired infections and for a range of gastrointestinal conditions that include Crohns disease, ulcerative colitis, and irritable bowel syndrome. The therapies are based on a proprietary compound discovered by Alverdy and colleagues at the University of Chicago. Midway Pharmaceuticals is a past winner of the New Venture Challenge at the University of Chicago Booth School of Business.

Drs. Pamukcu and Alverdy will talk about the journey so far from intriguing laboratory discovery at the University to business plan

and initial financing, and their experiences raising biotechnology venture capital.
